

Why DOGPAW?

Neither Clark County nor its Cities can pay for development of off-leash areas without help. Through DOGPAW, dog owners ensure development of spaces for their use.

As a non-profit organization, DOGPAW can partner with Vancouver-Clark Parks and Recreation, Washougal Parks and Recreation, Clark County Public Works and others, like Bonneville Power Administration, to secure and develop land for off-leash areas.

Why Are Dog Parks Important?

Bored, inactive dogs find ways to get into trouble. Well exercised dogs make better neighbors when they are able to get out and run and play regularly and burn off some of their energy. The parks are social outlets for dogs and their humans as well, and help us all connect and have a little badly needed play time!



In the long run, off-leash dog parks make a community safer, stronger and more pet friendly, and help people keep their pets happier and healthier; and sometimes even means they can keep them when otherwise they might be given up due to boredom related destructive behavior at home.

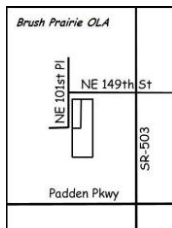

All of our parks are fenced and gated with various features. Wherever you travel, always be prepared with your own supplies, like plenty of water and waste bags.

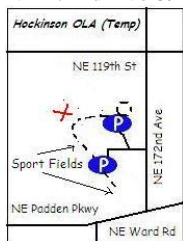
Brush Prairie (SR-503) NE 149th St & NE 101st Pl



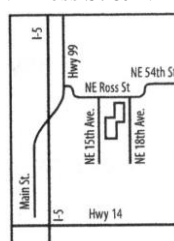
Dakota (East Vancouver) NE 18th St & NE 164th Ave



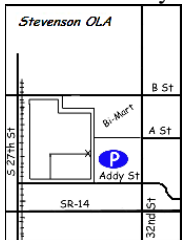
Hockinson (Temporary Spot) NE 172nd Ave & NE 119th St

Official Off-Leash  Dog Park Rules:

BY ENTERING THIS PARK YOU AGREE TO ABIDE BY THE POSTED RULES. THIS PARK IS FOR DOGS AND THEIR HANDLERS. ALL CHILDREN MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN ADULT AND SHOULD NOT BE ALLOWED TO PLAY UNATTENDED. ALL USERS OF THIS PARK DO SO AT THEIR OWN RISK AND ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY PROBLEMS CAUSED BY THEIR DOG.

1. Dogs under 4 months of age, female dogs in heat, unaltered male dogs over 1 year of age, and sick dogs are NOT allowed.
2. Your dog MUST be licensed, vaccinated, and wear an appropriate collar with tags. Pinch collars, prong, choke, spike, etc, are NOT allowed.
3. Dogs MUST be removed from the park at the first sign of aggression.
4. Handlers MUST promptly respond to any request to “call or control your dog”.
5. Do NOT allow your dog to jump on people or bark excessively.
6. Handlers MUST immediately clean up by picking up waste and filling any holes created by their dog.
7. Under NO circumstances are you allowed to leave your dog or child unsupervised in the park.
8. Handlers MUST leash and unleash their dog within the double-gated entrance and carry a leash for each dog.
9. Food, smoking, and glass containers are PROHIBITED.
